Fashion design involves the creative concepts while pattern drafting translates these concepts into constructed garment through draping, cutting and sewing. The combination of these disciplines is what gives ESMOD's methodology its added value and its graduates their unparalleled technical and creative expertise.

FD01L1 Personal Research and Development 2	2 Cr.

This course teaches students the process of developing a collection of skirts from start to finish.

This course explores a variety of fabrics, delving into their unique details.

FD06L1 Figure Base 4 Cr.

This course focuses on developing drawing and coloring skills while also exploring the color wheel.

FD11L3 Optical Illusion 2 r. This course helps students transform creative volumes into tangible garments and develop motifs and prints. FD89L3 Tailored Suit Collection Application 4 Cr. This course entails technically drawing a tailored suit jacket, incorporating all the details and zooming in for precision.

FD90L3 Digital Tools 2 Cr.

This course focuses on digitally illustrating a fashion figurine and creating an interesting layout.

PD08L3 Tailored Suit Assembly 2 Cr.

This course equips students with the knowledge to assemble all the details of the tailored suits and pants.

PD90L3 Tailored Suit Construction 4 Cr.

This course enables the comprehension and execution of the concept and intricate details of tailored suits and pants.

PD10L3 Tailored Suit Draping 2 CR.

This course focuses on translating designs using the draping technique.

PD11L3 Production Strategy 2 Cr.

In this course, students will develop a production file for industrial production.

PD16L3 Creative Pattern Drafting 2 Cr.

This course focuses on transforming basic patterns into creative details and patterns.

PD13L3 Tailored Suit Execution 4 Cr.

In this course, students will execute their personal designs.

FD30L4 Collection Approach 2 Cr.

In this course, students will enrich and develop their sources of inspiration.

FD86L4 Casual Wear Collection Application 4 Cr.

In this course, students will create and develop a coherent collection of casual wear jackets and coordinated pieces.

FD35L4 Enrichment Courses 1 2 Cr.

This course entails creating a styled final look with coordinated clothing and accessories, followed by a photoshoot aligned with a chosen theme.

FD84L4 Marketing 2 Cr.

Students will learn about modern marketing principles, covering theory and practice from strategic planning to branding and promotional techniques.

FD85L4 Digital Portfolio

2 Cr.

This course involves showcasing research findings, developments, and work from previous semesters in a creative portfolio.

FD34L4 Final Exam

4 Cr.

Students will present their final collection.

PD8₁L4 Casual Wear Technique

2 Cr.

This course focuses on understanding and constructing the concept of casual wear.

PD28L4 Casual Wear Assembly

2 Cr.

In this course, students will execute and assemble casual wear jackets featuring zipper closures, denim pockets, ribbed details and different sleeve designs.

PD29L4 Realization of Group Casual wear

4 Cr.

In this course, students will collaborate as a group to construct and execute a three-piece total look from the fashion design class, with a focus on fit, volume and textile.

PD82L4 Pattern Drafting Technique

2 Cr.

This course emphasized collaboration and idea exchange among students, incorporating new techniques and materials (fabrics) into their work.

PD30L4 Final Total Look

4 Cr.

This course entails selecting one total look from the final fashion design project, choosing between casual wear or a tailored suit, to execute.

FD91L5 Sector and Collection Context

2 Cr.

This course covers the following learning objectives:

- Identifying the codes of a chosen sector based on client preferences.
- Selecting appropriate fabrics and conducting finishing studies.
- Developing a theme and working on a mood board incorporating colors and fabrics.

FD92L5 Creative Approach

4 Cr.

This course focuses on creating volumes through creative exercises.

FD93L5 Collection Development

2 Cr.

In this course, students will learn to enrich a collection by developing a concept, and creating a comprehensive collection plan.

FD94L5 Jury 1

2 Cr.

In this course, students will learn how to visually present the story of a collection, drawing inspiration from various artists.

FD95L5 Jury 2

2 Cr.

In this course, students will learn how to present the plan of the entire collection, including a complete closet and a collection plan, using a kadapack.

PD91L5 Advanced Pattern Drafting Technique 1

2 Cr.

This course focuses on designing a strapless garment with various closure options, and creating a vest tailored to their chosen sector.

PD92L5 Advanced Assembly

2 Cr.

In this course, students will practice applying different finishings inside an unlined jacket and draping a couture dress.

PD93L5 Sleeve Development

4 Cr.

This course challenges students to unleash their creativity by modifying the sleeves of prescribed tailored suit and adapting them into their final collection.

PD94L5 Volume Development

4 Cr.

In this course, students will conduct research and develop a volume for their final collection. They will then adapt this volume to the coat design incorporating it in the lineup of 12 final products.

PD95L5 Production Strategy

2 Cr.

In this course, students will develop a comprehensive professional folder containing all production information, including technical sheets, costing sheets, measurements, finishings and sewing plans.

FDPDL5 Internship Report

4 Cr.

The internship report includes relevant details regarding the intern's experience, including a description of the position within the organization, completed tasks, and acquired skills.

FD96L6 Technique, Fabrics and Finishings

2 Cr.

This course covers the following learning objectives:

- Personalizing the silhouette according to each student's style.
- Creating a balanced collection plan that harmonizes different pieces.
- Elevating and refining garments to a higher level.

FD95L6 Commercial Line

2 Cr.

This course focuses on developing a secondary line featuring a commercially-oriented and simplified version.

FD94L6 Design Portfolio

2 Cı

This course teaches students how to create a portfolio with attention to both layout and content, and styling and coordinating pieces with accessories. They will also gain skills in conducting photoshoots and producing shooting catalogues.

FD93L6 Jury 3

2 Cr.

Students will complete the development of a commercial line consisting of 12 final pieces.

FD97L6 Jury 4

2 Cr.

Students will focus on three main aspects: the development of the main line, the creation of a commercial line, and the enhancement of brand development.

FD46L6 Coaching Marketing and Branding

2 Cr.

This course teaches students how to position their brand in the market and conduct pricing studies. They will also learn how to create a brand identity including a logo and packaging.

FD99L6 Graduate Project

4 Cr.

The graduate project includes three key components: the creation of the main collection, the development of a commercial line, and the design of packaging solutions.
