FUNDRAISING CAMPAIGN 150 YEARS OF USJ



One of the pillars of our new fundraising campaign "USJ, Aspire for More", launched as part of the Saint Joseph University of Beirut's (USJ) 150th anniversary celebration in 2025, is to achieve "More Heritage Conservation." This initiative aims to fund various projects including those of the Oriental Library (BO), the USJ Choir, the Museum of Lebanese Prehistory (MPL), amphitheaters, and the Béryte and Monnot theaters.

With a rich cultural and artistic heritage, USJ is deeply committed to preserving its legacy. It is our responsibility to safeguard collective memory and ensure that the treasures of the past remain accessible to future generations.

EQUIPMENT FOR THE ORIENTAL LIBRARY (BO)

The Oriental Library, founded on the rich troves gathered by generations of Jesuit scholars since the 19th century, is a leading research institution specializing in Middle Eastern studies. As the third largest private heritage library in the region, it houses an extensive collection of 230,000 volumes, including early editions of chronicles and travelogues by Oriental scholars, alongside works by Arab poets and intellectuals. The library also holds 1,800 journals and periodicals, an extensive collection of Armenian studies materials, and a rich collection of newspapers and magazines dating back to the early days of the Arabic press in Beirut and Cairo during the late 19th century. Additionally, the library possesses 250 lithographs and 3,700 manuscripts in Arabic and other Oriental languages including Syriac, Turkish, Persian, and Armenian. Its map collection features 4,110 historical maps and geographical plans of Lebanon and the region, while its photo archive, comprising 250,000 images, is the largest and most comprehensive in the Middle East. Furthermore, from 1906 to 2000, the Oriental Library published the annual multidisciplinary journal *Mélanges de l'Université Saint-Joseph*, which covered archaeology, history, epigraphy, and philology of the Near and Middle East.

Digitizing the periodical collection is crucial for its preservation and requires specialized equipment.

Digitalization Equipment for the Oriental Library (BO).

2. APPLICANT

3. PROJECT DESCRIPTION AND OBJECTIVES

Digitizing the periodicals collection is essential to preserving the Oriental Library's intellectual and cultural heritage. This project will not only streamline the management of these invaluable resources but also enhance their accessibility and utility. By facilitating online access, this project supports the rising trend of digital research, reduces the necessity for physical travel by researchers, and boosts research efficiency.

Furthermore, digitization will foster research within the Saint Joseph University of Beirut, and extend its impact to other local and international universities. Additionally, digitization strengthens the collection's security, offering improved management, monitoring fluctuations in the periodicals, and creating a sustainable database.

The library requires the acquisition of a Bookeye BE5 V2 Professional Book Scanner (14% larger than A2 format: $460 \times 620 \text{ mm}$) to digitize its collection and other materials, including old books.

- Resources
