Specialized Arabic Language Diploma

Objectives

Under the auspices of the Center for Research in Translation Studies, Arabic Terminology and Languages (CERTTAL), faculty members of the Center for Arabic Research and Studies (CREA) affiliated with the Faculty of Languages and Translation (FdLT) of Saint Joseph University of Beirut, have developed the **DALE and DALS** tests.

These certification tests, already implemented in partner institutes and universities abroad, are designed in accordance with proficiency levels (A1.1 to C2) outlined in the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).

The tests evaluate proficiency in Modern Standard Arabic, focusing on the four language skills: oral comprehension and expression, written comprehension and expression.

The assessed levels include:

- DALE 1: CEFR levels A1, A2 and B1.
- DALE 2: Levels B2, C1 and C2.

As for the DALS, it assesses the ability to communicate effectively in Modern Standard Arabic across various professional domains such as healthcare, science, law, tourism, hospitality and catering industry.

Contents

The DALE and DALS tests entail a total duration of 3 hours and consist of four mandatory tests: oral comprehension, written comprehension, and written expression, which are administered on campus. The oral expression test is conducted individually with a CREA examiner, either on campus or remotely.

■ Target audience

The DALE is designed for individuals aged 15 and over who are seeking reliable, recognized validation of their skills in Modern Standard Arabic or Specialized Arabic, whether for academic, professional, or personal purposes.
