<b>ACADEMICS</b>	
<b>Academic calendar</b>	<p>The academic year officially runs from 1<sup>st</sup> October to 30<sup>th</sup> September of each year and it is divided into two semesters:</p> <p><b>First semester (winter):</b> mid-September – mid February</p> <p><b>Second semester (spring):</b> end February – mid July</p> <p><a href="#">Public, civil and religious holidays</a></p> <p>Each degree programme organizes its own calendar. Semester dates may vary from a study programme to another. For detailed information please check the <a href="#">degree program website</a></p>
<b>Exam sessions</b>	<p>Students can schedule their own exam timetable within the timeframe provided by each department.</p> <p><a href="#">Registration is mandatory to take exams.</a></p> <p><b>General calendar:</b></p> <p><b>1st semester:</b> January –February</p> <p><b>2nd semester:</b> June –July; September</p> <p>Each degree programme organizes its own calendar. <b>Italian language courses</b>	<p>The University of Turin offers a <b>40-hour</b> free of charge Italian language course in each semester at 3 different levels: beginner, intermediate, advanced.</p> <p>To obtain the related credits (<b>5 ECTS</b>), students need to attend at least 30 hours of classes and pass the final exam.</p> <p><a href="#">Italian language courses</a></p>

<b>Academic system</b>	<p><b>Credits:</b></p> <p><b><u>1 local credit (CFU) = 1 ECTS credit.</u></b></p> <p>1 CFU corresponds to 25 hours of work including lectures, laboratories, seminars, individual studies ect...</p> <p>Workload for incoming students is set out by sending institutions. As a general guidance, the average workload for 1-year full time studies is 60 CFU</p> <p><b>Grading system:</b></p> <p>The Italian grading scale runs from 0 to 30. Minimum score to pass an exam is <b>18</b>; the maximum is <b>30 e lode</b> (<i>cum laude</i>, “with distinction”).</p>
